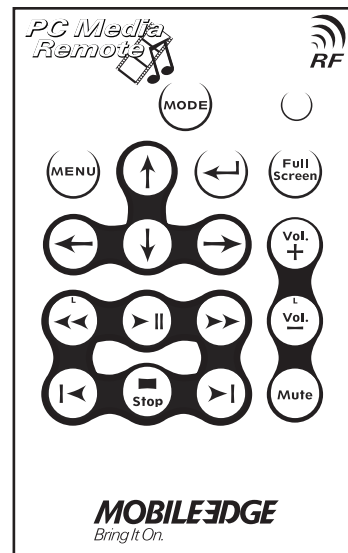

### Features

No line-of-site to the computer necessary, so you can manage presentations or enjoy your audio and video media without having to point your PC Media Remote at the computer!

The PC Media Remote is compatible with Windows Media Player, iTunes for Windows, WinDVD, and DVD Player for Mac, so you can enjoy all of your media wirelessly from up to 100 feet from the computer – perfect for your media center!

#### Slim, compact and easy to carry

The PC Media Remote is the handiest and most compact computer remote control, its USB Receiver is slim enough to snap into the Remote Control, which can then be stored in the card slot of your Notebook computer.

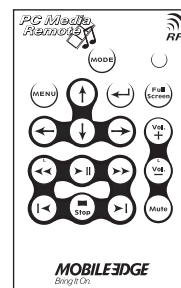


Fig. 1 - Front View

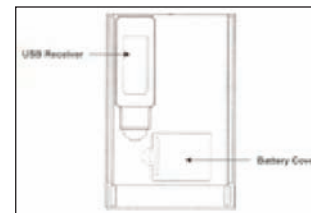


Fig. 2 - Rear View

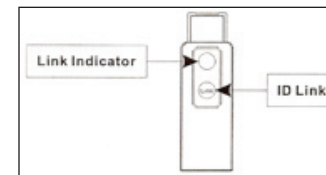
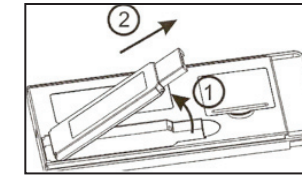
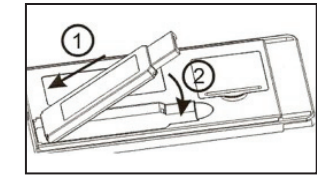


Fig. 3 - USB Receiver



Take out the USB Receiver

1. Pull up on the top of the USB Receiver
2. Take out the Receiver



Replace the USB Receiver

1. Insert the bottom of the USB Receiver, label upwards, into the compartment
2. Take out the Receiver

## Getting Started

### Initial Setup

#### Step 1: Inserting the battery

Open the battery cover on the back and insert the battery with the (+) side up.

**NOTE:** To conserve battery life, the PC Media Remote is turned "on" only when a button is pushed. It then automatically shuts down until the next time a button is pressed.

#### Step 2: Connecting the USB Receiver to your computer

The PC Media Remote and the USB Receiver are already linked.

Take out the USB Receiver attached on the back of the PC Media Remote and plug it into an available USB port.

You may encounter the following conditions with different Operating Systems:

- Windows 2000/XP  
The operation system identifies the Receiver, prompts "USB Human Interface Device" and begins installation automatically. Please follow the instruction on the screen to complete the installation procedure.
- Mac OS  
Insert the PC Media Remote's USB Receiver into an available USB port. A screen will appear on the monitor asking the user to press two keys on the keyboard. Once this is done, a second screen will appear and offer three choices of connection. Select "ANSI."

#### Step 3: Select the appropriate mode:

There are four application modes: Windows Media Player, iTunes for Windows, WinDVD, and DVD Player for Mac. To change Mode, press and hold the Mode button for two seconds and then release. The Mode Indicator light will indicate which mode you are in:

**No light:** Windows Media Player

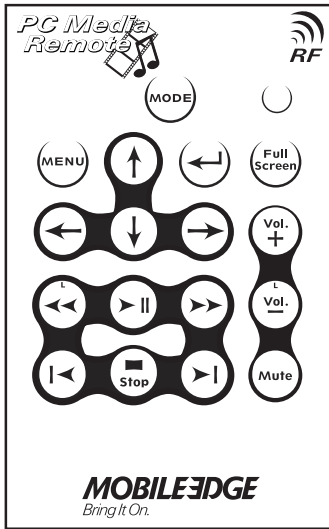
**Green light:** iTunes for Windows

**Orange light:** WinDVD

**Orange & Green light:** DVD Player for Mac

#### Step 4: Open the appropriate Multimedia program and enjoy!

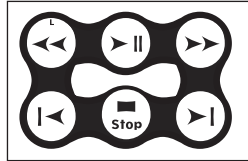
The PC Media Remote will remember the last mode selected, and start from that mode the next time it is used.



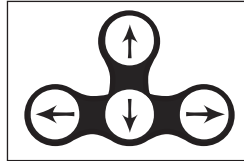
## Buttons and controls

Use the following chart to reference all of the buttons and features of your PC Media Remote.

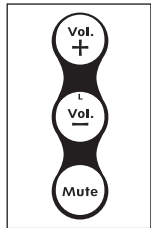
For your convenience, we have grouped buttons together in control schemes, making it easier to find and use buttons that are frequently used for specific functions and navigation.



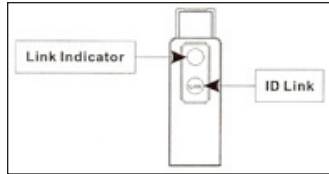

(MENU)	Press and hold for 3 seconds to use the laser pointer - only available in PowerPoint mode. The laser will automatically turn off when left idle for 30 minutes.

**Note:** In Windows Media Player, the Menu and Direction buttons are available only when in Full Screen.

#### Appendix A Regulatory Compliance FCC Statement on Class B
